Beloved of God,

Would you pray with me?

We're about to enter into a special time of prayer — just nine days — when the church through the ages have found prayer extra fruitful and meaningful.

The reason for the timing is significant — we are uniting in prayer the same way the disciples did for nine days in Jerusalem as they awaited the coming of the promised Holy Spirit. Jesus had just ascended into heaven (a feast we'll celebrate on Thursday, May 9), and he instructed them "not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, 'you heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." (Acts 1:4-5).

As promised, the Holy Spirit came with power and promise upon the whole church on Pentecost (a feast we'll celebrate on Sun., May 19), and the Spirit has guided, cleansed and empowered the Church ever since then.

As a way of preparing to welcome the Holy Spirit anew in our lives this May, I'd invite you all to join me in nine days of special prayer like those first disciples did. Below is a list of special prayer intentions for each of the Nine Days of Prayer. You can pray for each item as much or as little as you feel led. The united prayers of God's people are a holy and powerful force for good in our world.

We're also offering Morning Prayer on Zoom during our Nine Days of Prayer (except for Sunday, May 12, when we'll be joining in person for Morning Prayer at 10:30 am at the church). The information for joining the Zoom prayer sessions is found elsewhere in this newsletter.

I look forward to entering these holy days with you all!

#### Nine Days of Prayer for St. Peter's Church, 2024

Day 1 (Fri., May 10): Pray for our World. For world leaders to seek justice, freedom, and the dignity of every person. For nations at war to seek a way to cease fighting. For relief of famine, natural, and environmental disaster. For an end to persecution of Christians and all vulnerable people in every society. For corruption, violence and wickedness to be overcome by justice, peace, and right-eousness. For farmers and an abundance of food for all. For artists, athletes, musicians and storytellers to thrive.

Day 2 (Sat., May 11): Pray for Married people. For Christian marriages "to be a sign of Christ's love to this sinful and broken world, that unity may overcome estrangement, forgiveness heal guilt, and joy conquer despair" (BCP 429). For those engaged to be married. For marriages strained or failing, that God would bring healing. For Christianna and Jordan, our parishioners who will be married today.

Day 3 (Sun., May 12): Pray for the Departed and for Resurrection Hope. For those who have died in the hope of Christ, that their joy may be fulfilled in God's presence. For those who mourn, the "strength to meet the days ahead in the comfort of a reasonable and holy hope, in the joyful expectation of eternal life with those they love" (BCP 481). For the joy of Easter never to leave us. For God to grant us a holy death and to know his presence always.

Day 4 (Mon., May 13): Pray for those who Suffer and Those in any Trouble. For the sick. For those suffering from depression, mental illness and addiction. For prisoners and their families. For the poor and neglected. For refugees and immigrants. For physically disabled people. For the homeless. For the unemployed. For those facing discrimination and hatred. For the Capital City Rescue Mission, the Damian Center, Loaves and Fishes, and the Children's Cafe.

Day 5 (Tues., May 14): Pray for St. Peter's Church. For our parish to live out its mission to "Worship in Beauty. Practice Mercy. Hope in Jesus Christ." For our parishioners, from the youngest to the oldest. For our priest. For our staff. For our Guilds and lay leaders. For our choir. For the Daughters of the King, Julia Chapter. For God to raise up from our parish new leaders, to give us fresh vision and to give us a heart to reach our city. For our Vestry, which meets tonight.

Day 6 (Wed. May 15): Pray for Single people and Children. For singles to taste the love and presence of God in their lives in a powerful way. For them to enjoy deep and nurturing friendships and extended family circles. For those who feel called to marriage to find godly partners. For those who are single because of divorce or death to find healing and hope for the life ahead. For a particular blessing on youth and children — for protection and nurturing as lights of Christ in their generation.

Day 7 (Thurs., May 16): Pray for the Universal Church, its members, and its mission. For Christ's one, holy catholic and apostolic church throughout the world and throughout time. For Christian unity. For our part of the church: the Anglican Communion and Justin Welby, the Archbishop of Canterbury. For the Episcopal Church and Michael Curry, Presiding Bishop. For the Diocese of Albany and Jeremiah Williamson, our bishop. For the ministry of all the baptized and of all bishops, priests and deacons. For the gospel to be rightly preached and the sacraments to be rightly administered. For an increase in baptisms and confirmations. For Christopher, Nathan and Cole, who will be confirmed tonight.

Day 8 (Fri., May 17): Pray for the Nation and all in authority and service. For the Congress, President, and Supreme Court of these United States. For the state Assembly and Senate, our Governor, and New York courts. For our city of Albany: our Common Council, our Mayor, and the courts. For the military, police officers, firefighters, emergency workers, health care workers, and all government employees. For utility and sanitation workers. For schools and teachers. For the news media. For business people and all workers.

Day 9 (Sat., May 18): Pray for the Coming of the Holy Spirit. For a fresh encounter of the Holy Spirit to direct, fill and rule our lives this Pentecost, individually and as a parish. "Almighty and eternal God, so draw our hearts to thee, so guide our minds, so fill our imaginations, so control our wills, that we may be wholly thine, utterly dedicated unto thee; and then use us, we pray thee, as thou wilt, and always to thy glory and the welfare of thy people; through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen" (BCP 832).

## Mother's Day

It was during the 19th century in the United States that women's groups tried to establish holidays in favor of peace and against war. For example, in 1868 Ann Jarvis organized a committee to establish a "Mother's Friendship Day" for the purpose of reuniting families that had been divided by the Civil War. In 1887 in New York City, Julia Ward Howe led a Mother's Day for Peace.

Mother's Day was established by Anna Jarvis, the daughter of Ann Jarvis, with the help of Philadelphia merchant John Wanamaker. The first official service of worship was held in the Saint Andrew's Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton, West Virginia on May 10<sup>th</sup> 1908. This was followed later by resolutions passed by Congress, Presidential Proclamations and even special stamps commemorating Mother's Day. The Saint Andrew's Methodist Episcopal Church is now a National Historic Landmark and the international Mother's Day Shrine.

Mother's Day today is an annual holiday celebrated in the United States on the second Sunday in May. Popular observances include holiday cards, gift giving, church services, distribution of carnations, and special dinners.

Here in Albany we celebrate Mother's Day with a Tulip Festival. On the weekend preceding Mother's Day there is a State Street scrubbing by girls wearing authentic Dutch costumes. There is also an introduction of the Tulip Queen and her consorts. On Mother's Day the tulips are on display, along with food vendors and music groups. The tulips are located between such monuments as the King Memorial Fountain, erected in 1893 showing a statue of Moses on Mount Horab smiting the rock for water; the Robert Burns Statue of bronze erected in 1888; the Dr James H. Armsby Memorial erected in 1879, which is a bust of the co-founder of Albany Medical college; a large bolder, the Marinus Willet Memorial in honor of Colonel Willet of the French and Indian Wars; the Soldiers and Sailors Monument erected in 1912 and dedicated to Civil War Veterans, and finally the Henry Johnson Memorial in honor of a World War One hero.










#### Approval of the Vestry Meeting Minutes, February 12th, 2024

The vestry minutes from the February 12th, 2024 meeting were approved on a motion by J. Russom, seconded by D. Spath, then unanimously approved by the vestry.

#### Rector's Report - Mtr. Christina

#### Pastoral updates:

Introduced Burning of the Palms service during the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on Feb. 13. It went well, and I think a flamethrower is a yearly tradition now.

Led Ash Wednesday worship at noon and 5:30 on Feb. 14. We had twice as many worshippers this year as last year.

Began leading Morning Prayer on Zoom on Lenten Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays at 6:30 am.

Led the second February session of St. Peter's Prayer School (Confession and Examen) on Ash Wednesday afternoon.

Began co-teaching the weekly Lenten Saints study on Sundays after the 10:30 service with John Davis.

Officiated Evensong on Feb. 23 and March 8.

Participated in the "Play" session of Winter Family Disciple on March 9 by taking a hike at Five Rivers and going out for ice cream or hot cocoa afterward. Already getting signups for Spring Family Disciple (it's going to be really fun).

Did one home visit and one hospital visit (last rites).

Attended the consecration of the Rt. Rev. Jeremiah Williamson on Feb. 24, along with a good showing of our parishioners.

Working with the Diocese and with our parish committee on preparations for the liturgy and reception at the Institution service on April 7.

Led Children's Chapel on Sunday, March 3.


