Beloved of God,

Green is your color.

At least, it's going to be the "color" in church for a long time now. The "green season" – when our frontals, my stole, and other church adornments are green, is upon us. It's green from the Sunday after Trinity (white) all the way until the end of the church year on Christ the King Sunday (white) in late November. (We do take another "white" break to celebrate All Saints' Day).

The official name for this church season is "Ordinary time." It's where we spend half of our lives as Christians in the Episcopal tradition. So, it seemed fitting to take a moment this month to reflect on the "ordinary" Christian life.

Technically, "green time" begins in January. Once we pass through the purple and white seasons of preparation (Advent) and celebration (Christmas), there is a period of several weeks after Epiphany where we are in ordinary time and begin to hear the stories of the start of Jesus' earthly ministry and teaching. After the long interruption of Lent and Easter, Ordinary time resumes. And we find ourselves with Jesus in the everyday, the "ordinary" moments of his travels, of his teaching and of his miracles.

A lot of "ordinary" things happen in our lives in "green time" as well. In January, we recover from the holidays and return to work and school. In June, we work in our gardens, enjoy our kids on school break, and travel. In the "green time" of fall, we return to school and regular routines.

Regular. Ordinary. It's where life happens. We punch the clock, change diapers, mow the lawn or rake the leaves, empty the dishwasher, get the oil changed, tie our shoes.

It's the same with our Ordinary life with Christ. We say our prayers over dinner or at bedtime. We go to church on Sundays. We serve in the ways we're called – feeding the hungry, arranging flowers for the altar, praying for the sick on our prayer list, learning a new anthem.

Here's the secret to "green time": like the green things exploding in late spring splendor all around us, this is the time when growth really happens. As a parent, I sometimes find myself looking at my kids and realizing with a jolt that they are no longer as small as they were.

It's the same with us. In the blessed pattern of an ordinary Christian life, our growth really happens. I love the big holy days and special seasons of our church, but I also love the quiet beauty that grows and thrives in this season.

So, do not neglect to savor the quiet, everyday majesty of our ordinary life with Jesus. Savor him by dusting off your Bible and reading a chapter once a day. Savor him by saying the Lord's Prayer before you go to bed. Savor him by trying one new thing at church this "green" season that you've never tried before now.

Savor this quiet, holy time intermingled with toast and taxes. Because you may not notice the growth of the life of God within you, but it will happen. And on the Harvest Day, when the Lord of the harvest comes, we will be able to glorify him for giving the growth.

From the Archives

ENTRANCE TO ST. PETER'S CHURCH

Before entering the church there are plaques on the outside walls. These include one for early church construction and one for former Rector Eggenshiller, one for former Rector Laman Bruner, and one for Edgar Luby who was active in the church and for whom the church tower is dedicated.

To enter the church we climb the stairs to the Vestibule. Underneath these stairs is the burial place of George Augustus Viscount Lord Howe, a British Brigadier General who was killed July 6, 1758 on a march to Fort Ticonderoga. At the entrance to the Vestibule are two possibly Tiffany stained glass windows above the front doors. The first window depicts an ornate bishops miter with accompanying ribbons. The second depicts decorative ribbons.

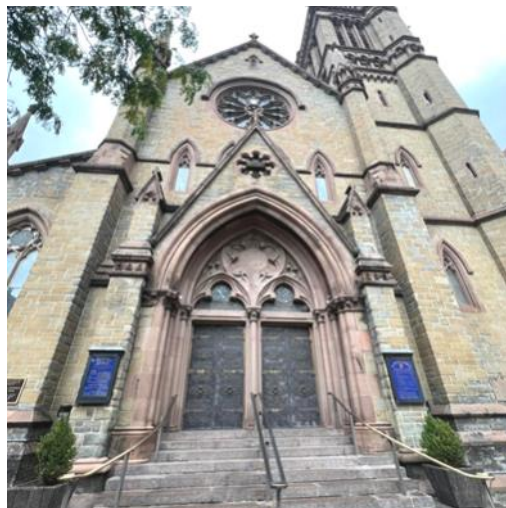
In the Vestibule are two plaques dedicated to Lord Howe. One is on the right wall facing into the church. It was placed on the wall to prevent deterioration when parishioners stepped on it. There is also a triangular plaque dedicated to Lord Howe on the floor of the Vestibule. Wall plaques on the Vestibule walls also include the 1980 plaque from the United States Department of the Interior, naming St. Peter's Church as a National Historic Landmark. On a front wall is a plaque in honor of George Monro, a Colonel Commander of the 35th Regiment of Foot, dated from 1700 to the 3rd of November 1757. It was dedicated by the Munro Clan Reserve Unit.

Above the entrance to the Narthex is a seal of Queen Ann Royal Arms done in color in bas relief. It was donated in memory of Albert Edward Oliver, Esq. a vestryman from 1944-1956. Inscribed in the seal are the words *Semper Eadem*, a motto of Queen Elizabeth I which means: "Always The Same". Also, in the Vestibule there is a plaque of dedication of the adjacent Narthex. It reads: "This Narthex is dedicated to the Glory of God and in Memory of Evelyn and Clarence Neuman".

It was not until 1875 that tower funds were made available. They were bequeathed from John Tweddle and his family. The tower was designed by Richard M. Upjohn and constructed by Messrs. Ellin and Co. of New York. It is impressive. It first rises 75 feet to a series of Recessed Arches. Above is the Belfry, which is 30 feet in height. There are a total of 12 bells, 11 of which are from the Meneely Bell Company of Troy, New York. The other bell was from an earlier version of the church.


Above the Belfry is a Parapet with exposed angles containing massive gargoyles with scary faces. Above this is the Roof which continues an additional 60 feet, to be surmounted by a stone Spire, which ends in a Finial which bears in gilded iron, the beautiful Double Cross of Holland.

Our Church Entrance is truly beautifully constructed.

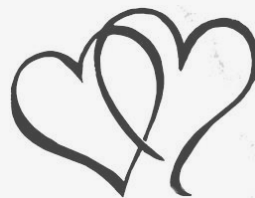

Outreach for March and April – S. DeBonis

St. Peter's continues to support Loaves and Fishes at the St. Francis Mission at least two Saturdays a month with a physical presence, serving food, helping people find clothing and housewares that they need from among the donations collected by Laura Saffares throughout the year, and sharing kindness and warmth with the guests. Over the winter Laura made several trips to the home of one donor to collect gently used clothing, just one of the many examples of her behind-the-scenes work. St. Peter's also continues to support the South End Children's Café, with donations to the free food cabinet as well as special gifts such as a donation from one friend of the Café for Easter egg dying kits for all the children.
